

FRATERNITY & SORORITY COALITION ASSESSMENT PROJECT



The purpose of the Fraternity & Sorority Coalition Assessment Project is to objectively assess and communicate the overall health of a fraternity and sorority community, in order to advance the fraternal movement within colleges and universities across North America.

The Project is a collaborative venture of five interfraternal partners: the North-American Interfraternity Conference, Inc., the National Panhellenic Conference, Inc., the Association of Fraternity/Sorority Advisors, the National Pan-Hellenic Council, Inc., and the National Association of Latino Fraternal Organizations, Inc.

Institutions may request the services of a Coalition Assessment Team, whose responsibility is to provide an expert review of the current state of the fraternity/sorority community. Teams are uniquely tailored to the make-up and needs of the host institution. After a one-to-two-day on-campus visit is completed, the team will prepare for the host institution a report that focuses on strengths, limitations, and recommendations in these five areas:

- Developing positive interpersonal relationships;
- Advancing leadership development;
- Strengthening social IQ, citizenship, and/or service learning;
- Assessing graduation rates of members and advancing academic interest;
- Effective campus interface to and support of the fraternity/sorority community.

TIMELINE

1. Institution requests an assessment and identifies possible dates for on-campus visit.
2. Letter of Agreement is sent to institution. Institution appoints Blue Ribbon Committee to serve as support for staff and community during and after the assessment (6-8 weeks prior to visit).
3. Team is selected.
4. Campus submits requested pre-visit data to Coalition (2 weeks prior to visit)
5. Logistics of on-campus visit are finalized (3 days prior to visit).
6. On-campus Coalition Assessment occurs. Team confers and writes final report.
7. Report edited by Coalition Director and campus contact. Final report received by campus (within 6-8 weeks after visit). Team Lead returns to campus to present final report to stakeholders (optional).
8. Follow-up with campus by Coalition Director (at 3, 6, and 12-months of visit).

COST

The cost of an assessment depends on the size of the fraternity/sorority community. Campuses are encouraged to seek funding from the President or Chancellor, or Vice President for Student Affairs.

- 12 or fewer chapters: \$4000 fee plus travel and expenses for team members
- 13-30 chapters: \$6000 fee plus travel and expenses for team members
- 31 or more chapters: \$8000 fee plus travel and expenses for team members
